Message From Pastor Art

For many people in our self-centered world the church is not a live option. The church makes no difference. It does not matter. It is not necessary or crucial. It is not where the action is. There is no reason for anyone to join the church. If you have joined, there is no reason to stay.

A person joins the Rotary Club for fellowship (or whatever group you want). He joins the YMCA or an athletic club for athletic things and a healthy life style. He joins the country club for fun, the political party for power, the company for money, and the family for love. He does not see why he should join the church. If he has joined, and can't see why he should stay or contribute his time and his hard earned money.

There is only one reason to join the church. For that matter, there is only one reason to join anything. You join it because it has something or does something you don't get anywhere else. What do you get in the church?

YOU GET YOURSELF! You join because it is in your self interest. You will learn more about yourself by joining. You will experience more. You will be more effective as a person. "I came," Jesus said "that you may have life, and have it abundantly." (John 10:10)

It was the Greek word for "surplus". It was the word for "super abundance". I join the church because I want my life to be "super abundant". I want to experience everything I possibly am before I die. I want to think all there is to think. I want to feel all there is to feel. I want to do all there is to do. In a word, I want to maximize myself. I want to be everything it is in me to be. Now you may argue with me that this is a curious place to begin- with myself, and what I can get out of the church, rather than what I can give to it. But maybe it is an honest place to begin.

We join a thing for what we can get out of it. If we aren't getting anything out of it, we do not join or if we join, we quit. For if we have joined, then we either get something out of it or we get out, physically and emotionally.

Consider the word SALVATION. It meant to "make whole". Jesus was offering person wholeness. He was offering every person wholeness. The fact of the matter is that what the church offers that you don't get anywhere else is a SAVIOR. Without Jesus you are less likely to want abundant life. The church are the people who keep me asking the "God" question. They are the people who keep me taking risks for other people. They are the people who keep me honest about myself.

And think about this: There was no set form of worship (do's and don'ts) in the first century church. These were only the basics: The basics were people, prayer, scripture, discussion, bread and wine. And now we argue about all those things.

I am a spiritual person having a human experience.

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order by President Roger Hendrix at 7:05 PM. Roger Hendrix led the group in devotions.

Adoption of Agenda: President Roger Hendrix presented the June agenda. Jan Patton added under “Old Business” a meeting at Clinton Heights to discuss “Cooperative Church Activities”. Barb Mounts made a motion to accept the agenda. Barbara Arnholt seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Acceptance of Minutes: Barbara Arnholt made a motion that the May 11, 2009 meeting minutes be approved by council. Joe Smith seconded the motion. Meeting minutes were accepted.

Treasurer’s Report: Treasurer Joe Smith reviewed the May 2009 Treasurer’s Report and made a motion that the report be accepted and approved. Tom Clouse seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Receipts exceeded expenses by \$4,487, increasing the general fund balance to \$6,566. There were receipts to the restricted fund of \$281: \$167 for the library, and \$114 for flood buckets. There was a \$128 disbursement for a coffee urn.

Pastor’s Report: Sermons are prepared through December and will be focused on famous operas, complete with music presentation. There was a “Secret Shopper” worship evaluator at the 11:00 service about 3 weeks ago.

Standing Committee Reports:

Education: Barb Mounts announced that a Capital University student, Shane Michael Sonneberg, has applied for the Youth Counselor position, and would be available for longer than one year. Graduation Sunday is June 21, 2009. Adult Sunday school is covered through November. Sara Minot will be sharing her volunteer experiences on June 28, and the Youth Gathering attendees will share their experiences on August 2. Rally Day will be September 13.

Property Committee: Bob Cromley announced that architect Gary Alexander will be presenting ideas and costs for an elevator. Johnny Steiner contributed window boxes and a potted flower to enhance the beauty of the church.

Financial Committee: The financial audit is underway with expectations it should be completed by the end of June, and will be presented to council at the next meeting.

Social Ministries: Jan Patton announced attendance for the Strawberry Festival was approximately 80 people, and the trailer for donated items will be on site from the 7th of June until the 14th. The July First Sunday Together will feature a pianist on July 5 and will be the second anniversary of the event. There will be no First Sunday Together in August, and the Chicken Barbeque will be the first Sunday in September. CRC has offered their van to transport people as necessary.

Worship and Music: There may have to be a brief council meeting in July or August to discuss changes in worship times, dependent on what the committee recommends for fall, at their next meeting.

Unfinished Business:

Cooperative Church Meeting: Jan Patton and Barb Mounts will be meeting with Pastor Wolfe of Clinton Heights and lay members of other churches on Tuesday June 9 to discuss possible interaction between churches. They will report at the next council meeting.

Nominating Committee: Roger Hendrix announced Liz Melick, Rich Pottorf, and Phil Scoles have agreed to participate on the Council Nominating Committee. Tom Clouse made a motion to approve their appointments. Jan Patton seconded the motion. Motion passed. Roger will inform the committee members they have been approved, and that they will need nominees for 6 positions. Due to the statute of limitations in the constitution the Secretary position must be someone new. Jan Patton, Nancilee Gray, and Tom Clouse have all informed Council they have completed their two year term and do not want to run again, leaving the Social Ministries, Evangelism, and Vice President positions open for new members. President Roger Hendrix, and Property/Finance Bob Cromley have completed their two year terms and are willing to run again for 2010-2011.

Synod Meeting Report: NCLC representative, Janelle Adler, will be preparing a report to be included in the Northern Light, concerning the June Synod Conference.

New Business:

Devotions Schedule: Pastor Art will be responsible for devotions at the September council meeting, Al Crossley for October, and Jan Patton for November.

Next Scheduled Meeting: The next scheduled meeting will be held Monday September 14, 2009 at 7:00 PM. There will be no meeting in July or August.

Meeting Adjournment: Meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM and closed with the Lord’s Prayer.

Southern Ohio Synod Assembly Report



(This is a synopsis of the full report given on June 7 during the Adult Sunday School Hour.)

The Southern Ohio Synod Assembly met at Capital University on Friday and Saturday, June 6 and 7. The theme for the assembly was “Feed My Sheep”, based upon Jesus command to Peter and ALL his disciples.

As a member of the Southern Ohio Synod NCELC has the opportunity to feed Jesus’ sheep in ways that an individual congregation could not do alone.

Amazing Grace Day Camps, week-long camps held each summer in Appalachia and inner city areas of the synod, enable congregations to minister to the needs of the children and families in their communities. Lutheran Outdoor Ministries joins the synod in planning and presenting these week long camps. This year a new partner is joining the effort to feed Jesus’ sheep - Lutheran Social Services of Central Ohio. LSS will bring the mobile food pantry to one Amazing Grace Day Camp site during each week of camp operations. Beside teaching and feeding the spiritual needs of children and their families, eight Amazing Day Camps will provide food for the families as well as others in the community.

Through the Southern Ohio Synod over \$400,000 was given to ELCA World Hunger. More than 10% of that money returned to the synod in the form of Domestic Hunger Grants. These grants will enable the receiving agencies to continue their fight against poverty and hunger.

The synod has hired Gary Pecuch to be the Director for Congregational Youth and Family Ministry. He is enthusiastic in meeting the needs of the youth in the Southern Ohio Synod.

A ministry to West African nationals is beginning in Columbus under the leadership of The Rev. Alexander Sumo of Liberia and The Rev. Jason Dennis of Ghana.

Although offerings to the synod have decreased due to the present economic conditions, the synod still sends 50% of monies received to the ELCA in mission support of the church wide endeavors.

The synod voted to become a Book of Faith synod and will encourage its congregations to become Book of Faith congregations. NCELC will begin the process in September.

A discussion on the proposed ELCA social statement: *Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust* occurred. A resolution was presented and passed that the Southern Ohio Synod reject the statement and affirm the current teaching documents. Although this vote does not mean that the ELCA will reject the statement, it does inform the church wide assembly that the Southern Ohio Synod does. This was a time of disappointment for me that my church did not support people of all sexual orientations and gender identities without exception.

Also discussed was the *Report and Recommendations on Ministry Policies*, which will also be voted upon at the 2009 Church wide Assembly. The Southern Ohio Synod rejected the report. This vote tells gay, lesbian, bi-sexual and transgender individuals in committed relationships that they are not welcome to be pastors or rostered leaders within the ELCA even if they feel that is what God is calling them to do.

Earth Keeping Ministry is a unique way to provide fresh vegetables and herbs so needed in a person’s diet. Planting a garden in a child’s wading pool can provide the needed vegetables for families and individuals in urban areas. A wading pool garden has been developed on an empty lot behind Faith Mission. Is this something that NCELC could do for its neighbors in the area?

Together the ELCA, the Southern Ohio Synod and NCELC can obey Jesus’ command to “feed my sheep”. This partnership permits all of us to do together what one of us cannot do alone. Thanks be to God for this partnership.

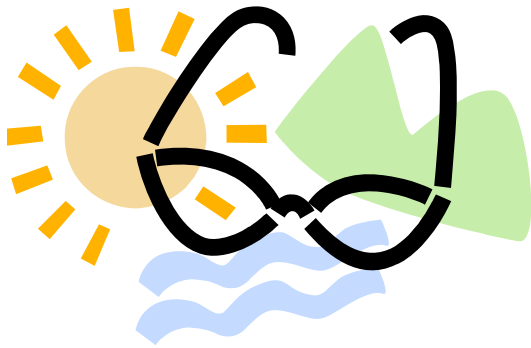

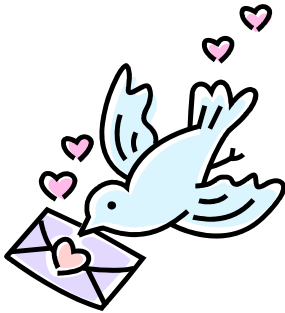
